All age talk

Do you ever get tired? So tired that you just want to lie down and go to sleep? There are a lot of things that makes us tired, like too many jobs to do and not enough time to do them. Or playing sports too often or getting too much homework, well we feel sometimes it's too much. And when we go on a long, boring journey? Sometimes people even get tired in church. People get tired physically. People also get tired spiritually. Here's why: I want you to think you have a huge rucksack and today we will put some different weights in it. First one is a big stone and it has the word anger on it. Put that in. And pray for them to be taken from our backs. Jesus takes the stones upon himself and we can feel the weight being taken from us and receive the rest we need. Of course they will come back at times but we need to keep praying and asking the Lord to take on our yoke as we walk with him.

Gospel Reading Mathew Ch. 11 verses 16 - 19 - 25 - 30

Sermon.

I'm exhausted ... I'm stressed to the limit ... I'm bone-tired ... I feel drained ... I'm running on fumes ... I'm on the edge. Have you ever heard yourself or someone else say those words? At one time or another, most of us have been there. We live in a fast-paced world, where we're often overachievers -- hurrying, rushing, working too hard, until our energies are depleted and our well-being is in tatters. And then we come to church. Welcome! Welcome to this church, -- this place for tired, weary people. In our text for today, Jesus gives a clear invitation and a promise: "Come to me, you who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest." We may come to church for many different reasons. But we also know that too many of us come here stressed and worried, troubled and tired. We really have to take time for Jesus' promise to work its way, into our very being. Jesus understood this need. He knew

the importance of rest -- time for replenishing his soul. People were often crowding around him; they wanted what he offered -- healing, forgiveness, courage, hope, life. Jesus is all compassion, He never turned anyone away. But he did take time to find a guiet place to rest and pray. In the text today, Jesus is giving us an invitation from his own practice: "Come to me ... and I will give you rest." Now let's do what it says! Let's take some silence, some time to rest, and allow Jesus' words to enter into your hearts and minds. Take a minute to be still. in the quiet, gifts are given that we cannot give ourselves. His yoke is a gift. Learn from this gift, turn to Jesus for the guidance and pray that the burden may be lightened. When our heart is open. The first is the gift of time. Time to be with Him, Jesus in church it provides the room for Jesus' invitation. He's echoing one of the Ten Commandments: "Remember the Sabbath, to keep it holy." Sabbath is a gift, a day of rest. We know when God made the world he worked six days, and then rested on the seventh day. If it was good enough for God, it's good enough for us. The second gift Jesus offers is release -- the opportunity to let go of stresses and pressures, release the inner obstacles that block us. The song from the film Frozen "Let it go, let it go." The words 'let it go' should be ones we take on board and rest when we are tired or like God on the seventh day we come into his presence and 'let it go' in our prayers and worship. Whatever dilemma, problem or anxiety is clogging our insides, "let it go." In the silence, this time of rest. The third gift in Jesus' invitation is the 'gift of the inner being' at peace. When we can let it go, we're removing all that stops us from being with God and just taking the time to do so. When we do this we will feel refreshed and God wants us to feel him give us fullness of life. That wellspring flows with goodness; it's the source of our being. Jesus tells us, "I have come that you might have abundant life" -fullness of life (John 10:10). Not existence, not half-life, but aliveness, fullness of life. This life force comes to us from the inner wellspring -- "that of God in every person. The fourth gift. When we go to God - we receive the gift of energy for our work in the world. We have to restore ourselves to do this we have to take time to allow the energy to be replaced. Jesus is our role model; He was often going off to pray, to re-connect. Then he would head back to his ministry. This pattern is the model for all of us. We all have our personal leadings, our callings for specific work that continues the mission of Jesus, those we serve. Come to me, Jesus says -- to my way, my practice. I will give you rest. This rest is better than sleep; it's rest for the soul. He's echoing Psalm 23: "The Lord is my shepherd. ... God leads me beside still waters. God restores my soul." Restores my deepest self! When we get to the place of genuine rest, we re-connect with the source of life, abundant life. Come to me, Jesus says, and find life-giving rest. Amen.

We are more used to asking God for a blessing than raising our voices to bless God ourselves, but that is what this psalm is about. All God's creatures praise and bless God, proclaiming his goodness and mercy to the whole world. The question for us today is: do we live out God's goodness and mercy as we live in the world? And, if we live it, do we also make God known?
