Gen.2,7: "Then the LORD God formed a man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being."

3Jn.2: John writes to Gaius: "Dear friend, I pray that you may enjoy good health and that all may go well with you, just as you are progressing spiritually."

Here is not an answer to the scientific question of human origin, but the answer to the more fundamental and far-reaching question of how we become *a living being*. Do you know? There is a past in which this question was answered – by God breathing into man *the breath of life*: in other words, by a spiritual principle in man living by and dependent on his/her God-connectedness.

This past did not become the future, however, as sin entered the world disrupting this connection and its life-giving quality.

How *now* does man become a *living being* as opposed to a dying, and indeed dead, one? Again, by divine breathing, Jn.20,21 (the risen Jesus appearing to the disciples and saying): "'Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.' And with that he breathed on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven.'" That is, by Word and Spirit.

Lord, breathe on us; send out those who preach your word faithfully and fearlessly and let the Spirit follow in our hearing.
