Mi.7,18: "Who is a God like you, who pardons sin and forgives the transgression of the remnant of his inheritance? You do not stay angry forever but delight to show mercy."

Rm.8,32: "He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all – how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?"
