Jeremiah 38: 6 "So they took Jeremiah and put him into the cistern of Malkijah, the king's son, which was in the courtyard of the guard. They lowered Jeremiah by ropes into the cistern; it had no water in it, only mud, and Jeremiah sank down into the mud."

Acts 8: 1 "On that day a great persecution broke out against the church at Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout Judea and Samaria."

Acts 9: 4 "He fell to the earth and heard a voice saying unto him, 'Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me?'" King James Version.

Sadly, persecution is not some distant historical fact it is happening right now in Ukraine. It may not be to do with religious belief but persecution can be for political or racial reasons as well. It's just a form of man's inhumanity to man.
